1. How do you imagine Oliver? Which *features* of his are described or implied in the text? (all possible kinds of features used to characterise a person) Which other features may he possess?

5. What can you assume about Oliver's previous experience of relationships? Give some example to illustrate your point.
What can you assume about Jennie's previous experience of relationships? Give some example to illustrate your point.
6. How would you *predict* the development of these relationships? What makes you think so?
Do you see any *problems* Oliver and Jennie may face if they stay together? Formulate them.
